The World Islamic Sciences and Education University supports Jordan's government efforts to combat poverty. Currently, 1.069 million Jordanians are living in absolute poverty, with 7,993 individuals experiencing extreme hunger poverty. To address this, the government is implementing cash transfer programs to cover 120,000 families in 2022 and provide wage support to 110,000 workers in the formal economy through the "Sustainability" program.

They also prioritize public safety matters and maintain beautiful green spaces on the campus. The department supervises all kiosks and restaurants within the university and ensures their compliance with public health and safety conditions.



The World Islamic Sciences and Education University is aware of the health risks associated with unsafe drinking water and poor sanitation, such as malnutrition and stunting. Therefore, they have implemented modern monitoring systems to track water consumption rates and have standardized the consumption amounts for individuals and services to meet international standards.

In addition, The World Islamic Sciences and Education University has taken measures to

prevent the spread of COVID-19 by providing WASH services and infection prevention control in health facilities. They have also implemented government policies to rationalize water consumption and developed a detailed irrigation and water consumption program.

The Department of Public Services provides safe water for various uses in university buildings, and the university closely monitors water distribution to ensure delivery to all buildings and amenities.

The World Islamic Sciences and Education University collaborated with the Ministry of Water and Irrigation and the German Agency for International Cooperation GIZ on a religious awareness project promoting water conservation from 2018 to the present. It ranked fifth among Jordanian universities. This confirms that all the aforementioned efforts align with SDG 6.



SDG7: AFFORDABLE AND CLEAN ENERGY

To achieve sustainable development standards related to affordable and clean energy, The World Islamic Sciences and Education University has optimized the utilization of clean energy at reasonable prices, which has resulted in reduced consumption and a reduction in energy costs. Also, The World Islamic Sciences and Education University takes into account the future renovation of these buildings within engineering standards that intersect with the principles of improving energy efficiency and

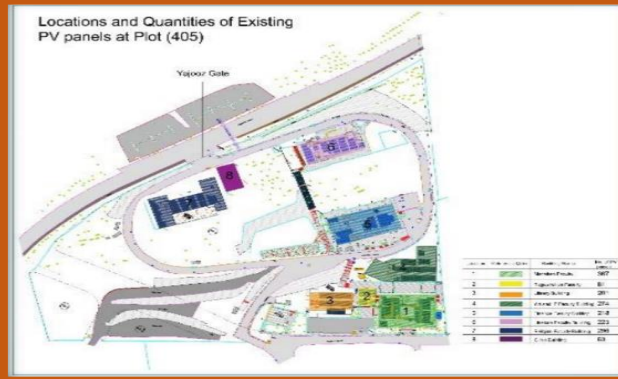


increasing their preservation in the university's plans from 2022 until today.

The university provides financial support from its Board of Trustees and Administration to conduct infrastructure projects in line with the goals of sustainable development, and priority is given in support to projects that fall within the sustainable development priorities and which the university seeks to achieve out of belief in its role in building and serving society.

These new projects are consistent with the university's sustainable development goals, as they are designed to use renewable energy to reduce the university's electricity bill in the coming years. The university is moving towards necessary projects and modernizing the infrastructure and technology in all university colleges.

By adopting sustainable development goals, The World Islamic Sciences and Education University was able to rationalize its energy, water, electricity, and fossil fuel consumption. Electricity consumption has decreased from 1526.4 GJ/Year to 814.09 GJ/Year since 2022. Water consumption was approximately 332 GJ. In

total, 1114.09 (GJ/Year) were consumed. Moreover, University buildings cover a total area of 50.62% for colleges, 13.48% for public facilities, 22.4% for administration, and 13.5% for student services. this implies that the Energy usage per sqm is about 3.16%.

Accordingly, The World Islamic Sciences and Education University aims to be a model in the field of renewable energy, in line with the seventh Sustainable Development Goal.



Finally, The World Islamic Sciences and Education University contributes to the development of the (SDG7) 'AFFORDABLE AND CLEAN ENERGY' by publishing different publications under this (SDG7). One of the recently published research: Lutfi et al (2023). Publishing the paper entitled "The role of intellectual capital on green supply chain management: Evidence from the Jordanian renewal energy companies".



SDG8: DECENT WORK AND ECONOMIC GROWTH

The World Islamic Sciences and Education University is dedicated to following Jordanian wage legislation to ensure that its workers have a decent standard of living. The World Islamic Sciences and Education University also takes into account the minimum wage (in JOD) approved by the tripartite committee established by the relevant ministry and the Jordanian currency, either in general or for a particular region or occupation. Its employment principles are also consistent with the Jordanian Labor Law, which prohibits wage discrimination and mandates that employers pay the minimum wage to their employees.



The World Islamic Sciences and Education University has over 620 employees, and it is committed to providing them with salaries that correspond to their work and the financial system. Jobs that pay enough for people to support themselves and their families are a critical aspect of economic growth, and The World Islamic Sciences and Education University recognizes its importance.

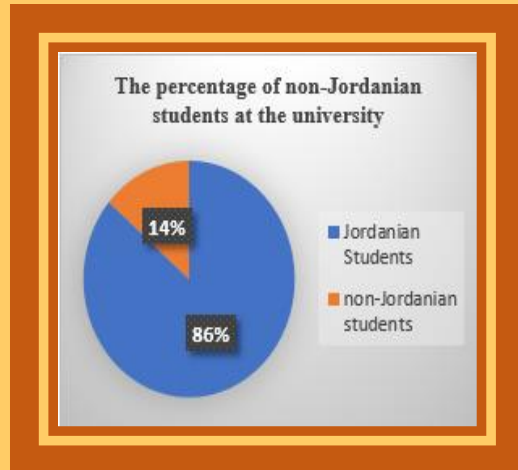

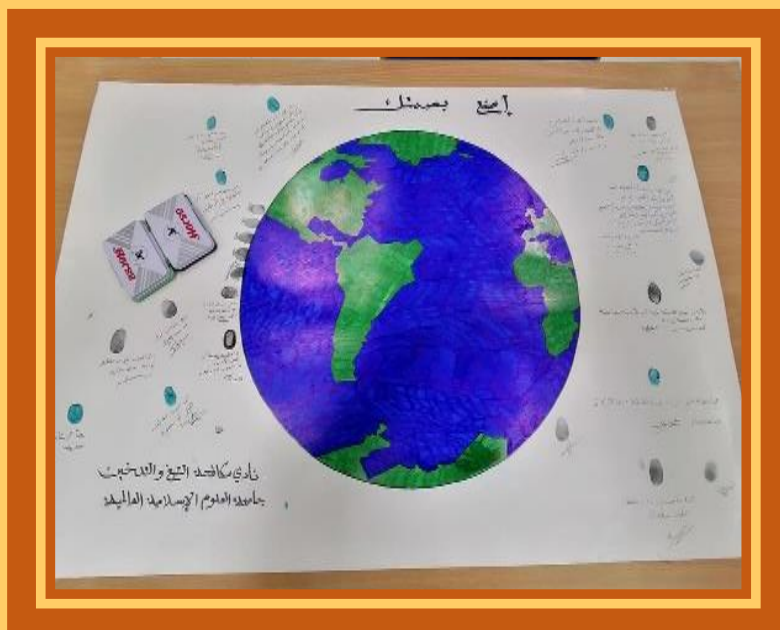

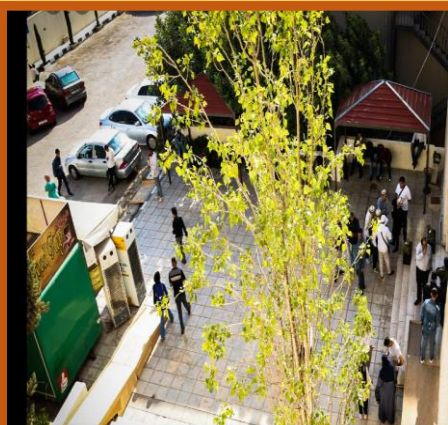
